If the court grants unlimited driving privileges to a first-time offender under section 4510.022 of the Revised Code, all penalties imposed upon the offender by the court under division (G)(1)(a)(ii) of this section for the offense apply, except that the court shall suspend any mandatory or additional jail term imposed by the court under division (G)(1)(a)(ii) of this section upon granting unlimited driving privileges in accordance with section 4510.022 of the Revised Code.

However, Columbus police and Ohio State Highway Patrol are increasingly cracking down as well on "drugged driving" – driving under the influence of marijuana or other drugs. According to the National Drug Control Policy, about 1 in 8 weekend nighttime drivers nationwide is driving under the influence of drugs.

Driving Under the Influence of Marijuana in Ohio ...

Ohio uses the term "operating a vehicle under the influence" (OVI) instead of "DUI.". An Ohio OVI is defined as operating a vehicle: with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of .08% or greater (or urine alcohol concentration of .11% or more) while "under the influence" (having an adverse effect on driving ability) of any controlled substance, alcohol, or combination of the two, or.

Ohio law uses the term "OVI" for the charge of operating a vehicle under the influence. An OVI is the same as a DUI (driving under the influence). Under Ohio law, a first offense OVI conviction can mean mandatory jail time, fines, and a license suspension for up to three years. The potential penalties for a first offense OVI are as follows:

Law enforcement officers, prosecutors, and judges in Ohio take driving under the influence of drugs every bit as seriously as they do drunk driving. In, fact, they use the same criminal code language of "operating a vehicle while intoxicated," or OVI, and impose the same basic penalties.

Penalties for Driving Under the Influence of Drugs in Ohio ...

Under Ohio law, drunk driving is referred to as Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated, or OVI. It is also commonly referred to as Driving Under the Influence or DUI. The first significant change is a longer "look-back period" for prior OVI convictions.

The Ohio law, which took effect on January 1, 2004, requires, rather than allows, courts to order people convicted of operating a vehicle under the influence (OVI) to display "restricted plates." The requirement applies to anyone to whom the courts grant limited driving privileges during a period of license suspension.

OHIO DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES

Driving under the influence (DUI) is the crime or offense of driving, operating, or being in control of a motor vehicle while impaired by alcohol or other drugs (including recreational drugs and those prescribed by physicians), to a level that renders the driver incapable of operating a motor vehicle safely.
